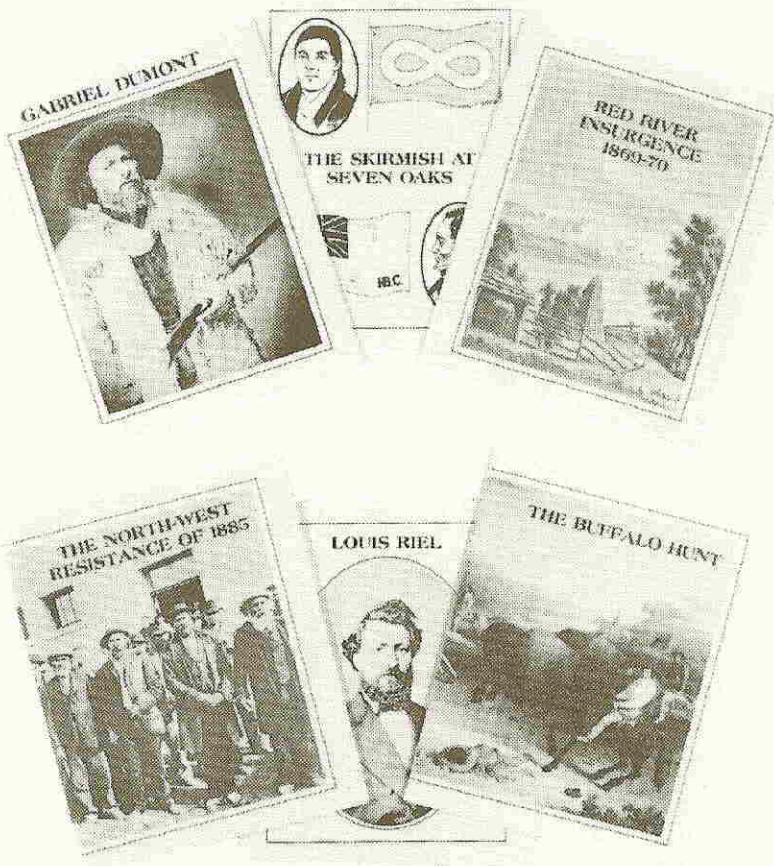

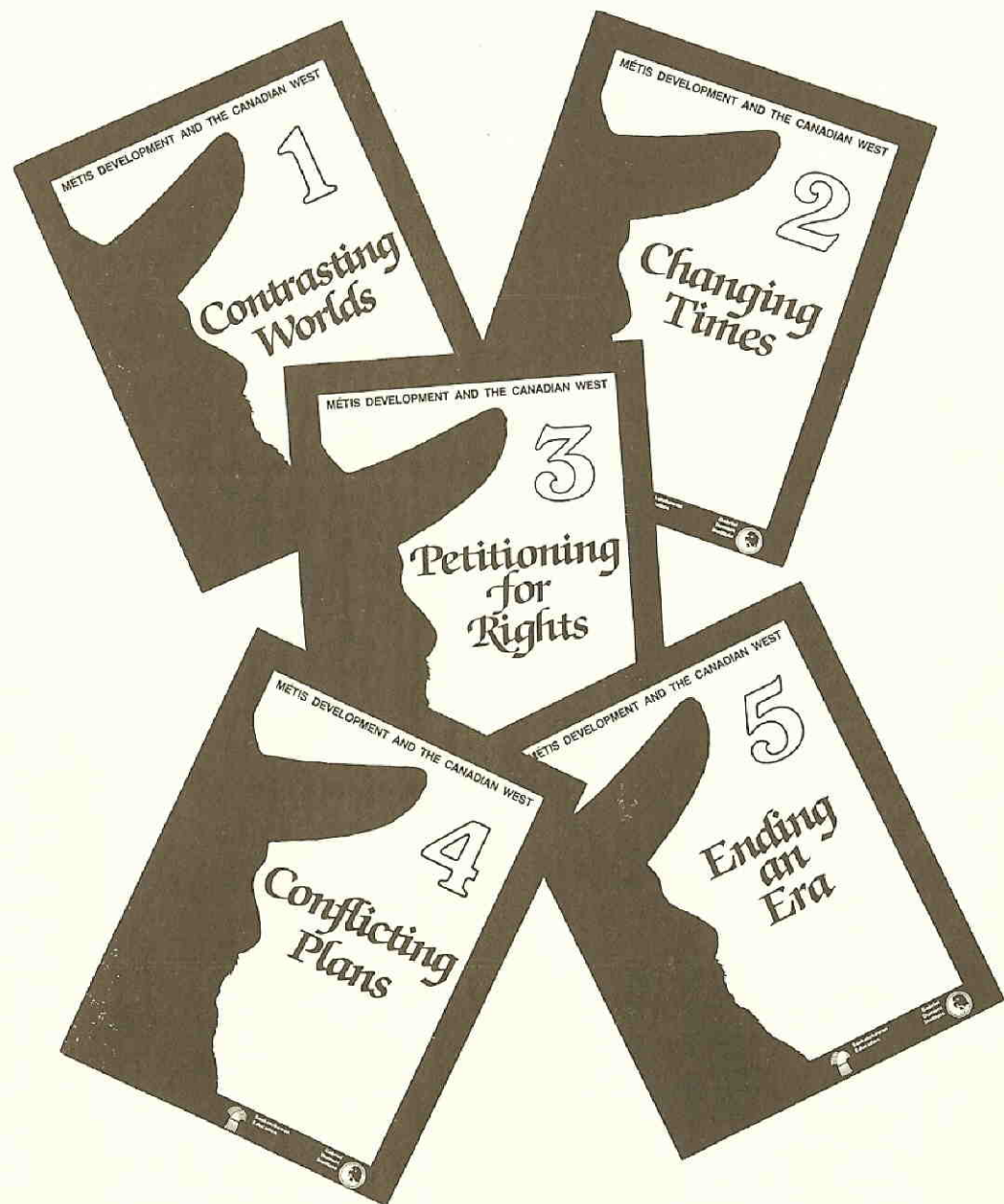

BOOK 1: CONTRASTING WORLDS is an overview of the Canadian West from the 1600's to the early 1870's when many of the Metis moved from the Red River area to Saskatchewan. (32 pages)

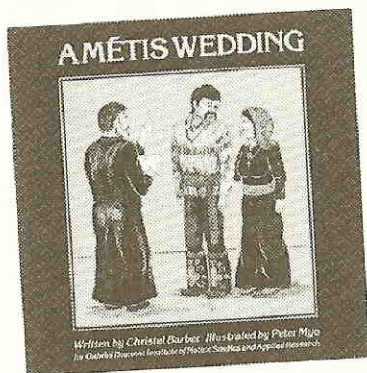

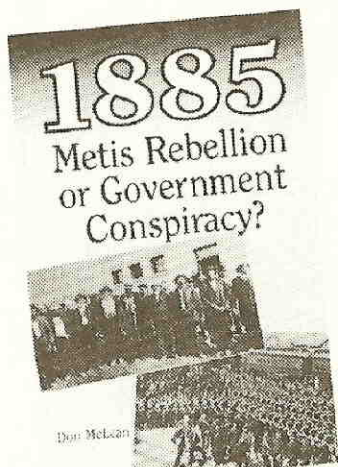

1885: METIS REBELLION OR GOVERNMENT CONSPIRACY?



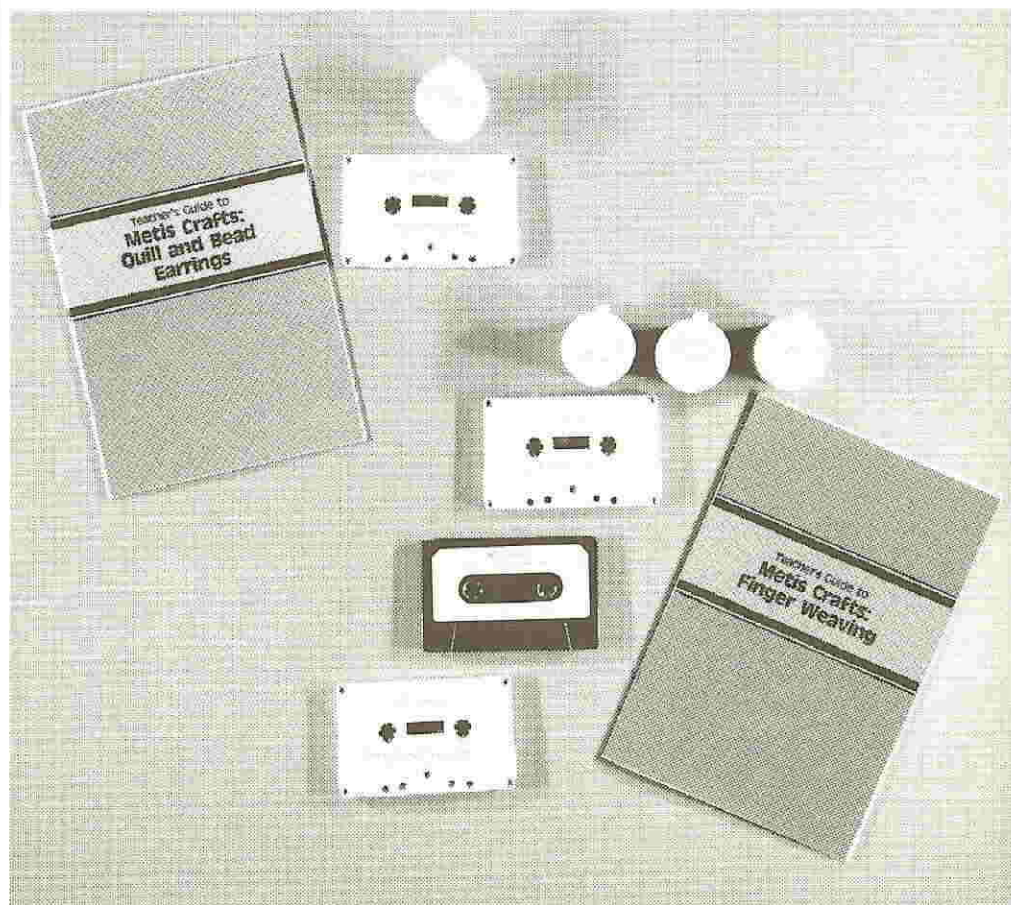

Since the mid 1700's beadwork had become an important component of Indian and Metis decoration. This audio-visual kit includes a filmstrip, audiotape and teacher's guide which gives step-by-step instructions for making earrings from seed beads and porcupine quills.

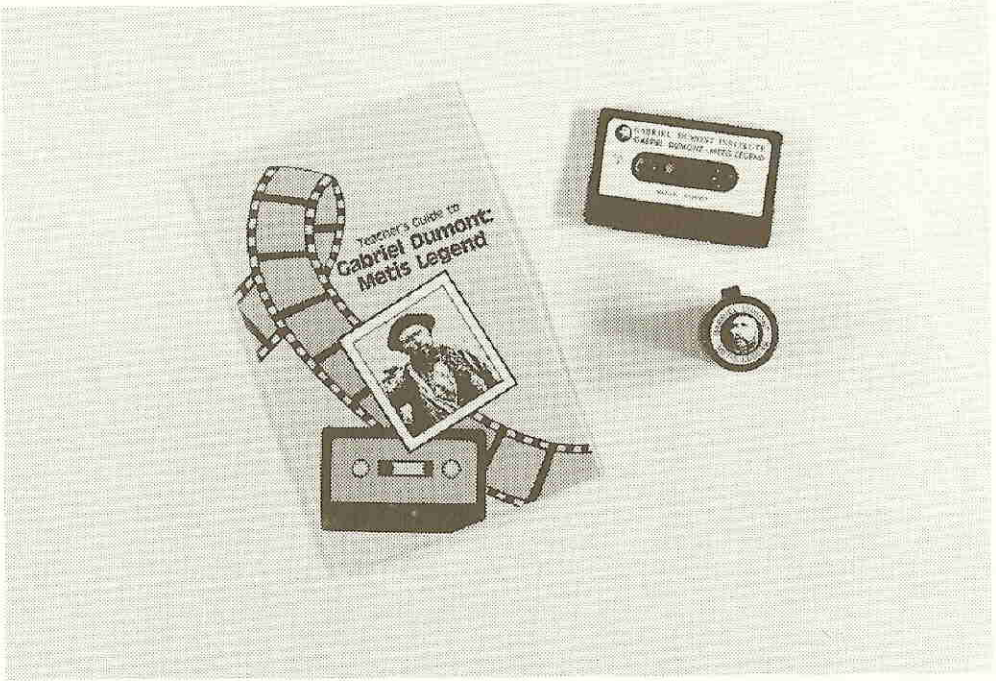


METIS CRAFTS: FINGER WEAVING

Finger weaving is a type of weaving found only in North America. The sash, probably the most distinctive article of Metis clothing, was traditionally finger woven. This audio-visual kit contains three filmstrips and audio tapes, as well as a teacher's guide, which gives step-by-step instructions for one-way finger weaving, two-way finger weaving and fancy or design finger weaving.

GABRIEL DUMONT: METIS LEGEND



In this audio-visual presentation the life of Gabriel Dumont, Metis leader and defender of rights, is depicted from the time of his birth in 1837 to his retirement in the late 19th century. We see Dumont as a very young child, as a youth learning the ways of his people and as a grown man helping his people make the transition from buffalo hunting to agriculture. It is in this context that his role during the 1885 Resistance is presented. The kit contains a filmstrip, audiotape and teacher's guide. Suggested for Grades 3-5.

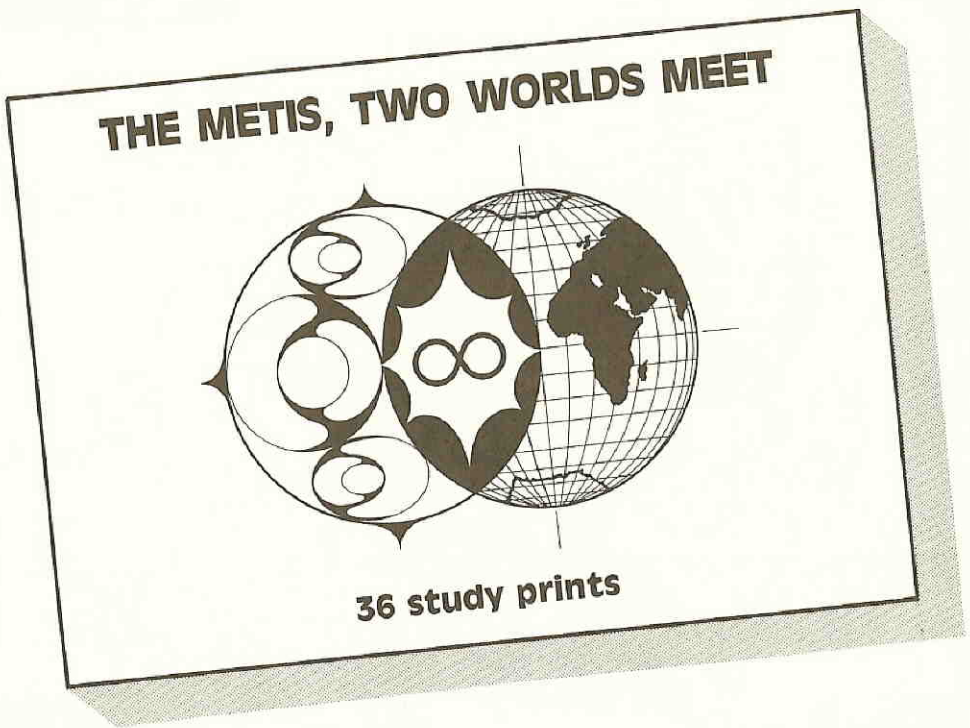

This full colour poster shows an infant sleeping in a moss-bag. The moss-bag and cradleboard were child-rearing devices which were common to virtually all North American Indian societies. The restrictive function that it served was believed to develop a disciplined and secure character. Lovingly wrapped and bound to the lavishly decorated cradleboards, Indian and Metis children were initiated into the cultural life of their families and communities. The flower beadwork done on a black cloth background is a style made popular by Metis women during the nineteenth century.
