MARIA CAMPBELL OF SASKATOON, AUTHOR OF HALFBREED (1973), AN AUTOBIOGRAPHY, AND SEVERAL OTHER WORKS ON THE HISTORY AND CULTURE OF THE PLAINS INDIANS AND THE METIS.

R. JAMES LAROCQUE, OF LEBRET, FARMER AND LOCAL HISTORIAN. MR. LAROCQUE LED THE LEBRET HISTORY BOOK COMMITTEE THAT PRODUCED AN ACCOUNT OF THAT HISTORIC METIS COMMUNITY CALLED MISSION TO LEBRET 1865 - 1989

CLOVIS REGNIER OF ST. LOUIS. CURRENTLY THE AREA DIRECTOR FOR WESTERN REGION 2 OF THE METIS SOCIETY OF SASKATCHEWAN, MR. REGNIER IS NOTED FOR HIS ANCESTRAL ASSOCIATION WITH BATOCHÉ, AND FOR HIS WORK AS AN EARLY POLITICAL ORGANIZER OF THE METIS.
