- o In the ten year period, 1978 to 1988, the population of Saskatchewan increased by 7.6 percent. In Cumberland House the population increased from 847 in 1978 to a high of 1,017 in 1975 (a 20 percent increase). Since that time, however, the Cumberland House population has steadily declined and in 1988 was only 869, a mere 2.6 percent higher than its 1978 population.
- Unlike Cumberland House, the La Loche population continues to expand, and from 1978 to 1988 shows an overall increase of just over 15 percent.

- ° The population age structure in Northern Saskatchewan has significant deviation from the age structure of the province as a whole.
- $^{\circ}$ Both La Loche and Cumberland House have a very young population base with approximately 40 percent in the 0 to 14 year age cohort. The comparative provincial proportion, of 0 to 14 year olds, is 24.3 percent.
- o La Loche and Cumberland House have extremely low numbers of elderly residents. In fact, the percentage of people age 45 and over in La Loche (11.4%) and Cumberland House (13.5%) closely approximate the provincial percentage for the 65 and over population (12.7%).


- Educational achievement in Northern Saskatchewan lags far behind that of the general provincial population. Only 19 percent of Saskatchewan adults, age 15 years and older, have less than a grade 9 education, the commonly used benchmark for functional literacy. Many of those with low levels of education are elderly.
- o In contrast, 40 percent of Cumberland House adults, age 15 and over, have less than a grade nine education. In La Loche this statistic rises to 65 percent. As very few elderly people live in these two communities, the poorly educated population is largely between the ages of 15 and 45 years.
- In sum, while one out of every two Saskatchewan residents does not have a high school diploma/certificate or other comparable level of training, in Cumberland House this figure rises to 7 out of ten and in La Loche, 8 out of ten.







Highlights

La Loche and Cumberland House have a less mobile population than other communities in Saskatchewan. While 58 percent of Saskatchewan residents did not move between the 1981 and 1986 census, this rose to approximately 68 percent in La Loche and Cumberland House.

Highlights

• While unemployment rates in Northern Saskatchewan are two to three times higher than the provincial average, the communities of La Loche and Cumberland House fare poorly even in a northern context. In these communities, 60 to 70 percent of young adults, age 15 to 24, were unemployed in 1986, and even older adults had unemployment rates as high as 35 percent in La Loche and 47 percent in Cumberland House.

- Very few family households in either La Loche (8.2%) or Cumberland House (6.5%) might be termed "empty nesters" or husband-wife families whose children have left home. In contrast, at least one-third of Saskatchewan families can be classified in the "empty nest" category.
- Seventeen percent of Saskatchewan families having children at home are headed by a single parent. Like other Northern Saskatchewan communities, La Loche and Cumberland House exhibit extremely high rates of lone-parent families, 30 and 38 percent respectively.
- While only a minority of Saskatchewan families (17.6%) have 3 or more children at home, Northern Saskatchewan communities show a marked variation. In Cumberland House more than half of the families with children (53.5%) have three or more living at home. In La Loche this figure rises to 63.6 percent.

Highlights

- Only 3 percent of the Cumberland House population are provincial public servants. In La Loche the figure is slightly higher at 4 percent. These differ considerably from La Ronge where 11 percent of the population have permanent positions with the provincial public service.
- In both communities health and education are the two largest provincial departments represented.



Only 4.6 percent of Saskatchewan households contain six or more members. In the north this figure rises dramatically to 26 percent and even this is exceeded greatly by the communities under study. In Cumberland House 39 percent of all households have six or more people. In La Loche this rises to 46 percent.

Highlights

o Not only do La Loche and Cumberland House have average family incomes which are eight to nine thousand dollars lower than those of other Saskatchewan households, but these incomes must support approximately twice as many household members. Whereas the average household in Saskatchewan earns approximately \$11,400 per household member, in La Loche and Cumberland House income per household member is only \$4,000.

Ounlike other communities in Saskatchewan, Government Transfer Payments provide a major source of income in Northern Saskatchewan. In both La Loche and Cumberland House, one-third of all income in the community comes from government transfer payments.

- The overall provincial dependency ratio has remained steady at 0.58 for the last ten years. Simply put, for each resident, of the province, who is between the ages of 15 and 64 years, there are 0.58 old or young dependent persons.
- Ten years ago both La Loche and Cumberland House had significantly high dependency ratios, 1.06 and 0.93, respectively. The working-age population approximately equalled the dependent population. Few of the dependents were elderly.
- Over the past ten years dependency ratios in both communities have decreased so that there are approximately 0.7 dependent persons for every person of working age.

- Although the death rates in Northern Saskatchewan remain significantly higher than those of the general population of the province, life expectancies continue to rise. Since 1975 the average life expectancy of a Saskatchewan resident has risen 3 years (73.8 to 76.5 years). In the same time period the average life expectancy in Northern Saskatchewan rose more than 6 years (from 65.3 to 71.6).
- In a comparative sense, current life expectany in Northern Saskatchewan (71.6 years) is similar to those of the total province in the early 1970's.
