

The Gabriel Dumont Institute Board of Governors wishes to extend a warm welcome to all the delegates attending this year's Conference.


Our Metis culture and identity are important priorities for the future of our youth. We must take this time to reflect on the past, discuss the present and plan for the future of our Metis cultural identity.





## Dr. Colin MacColl Calgary, Alberta

Born in Guelph, Ontario, of Metis heritage and raised in Northern Saskatchewan, Colin attended the University of Saskatchewan for one year before deciding on a career in Medicine. Then, through commitment and hard work, he graduated with distinction in 1987. He practiced for one year before deciding to specialize in Surgery. He is presently the Chief Resident for General Surgery at the Calgary Foothills Hospital. He plans to further his specialization in either Pediatric Surgery or Colon and Rectal Surgery.

Dr. MacColl's hopes for the future include returning to Saskatchewan to practice in an area with a high Aboriginal population, both in the community and in his practice.

#### Keith Goulet, MLA Cumberland House, Saskatchewan

Mr. Goulet, a Metis, born and raised in Cumberland House, is a fluent speaker and writer of Cree. His knowledge of his language has been beneficial throughout his distinguished career.

Keith achieved his Bachelor of Education degree, then went on to receive a Masters of Education in Curriculum. His thesis was an oral history of the Sandy Bay Cree.

He has been a teacher, consultant, and an administrator. Keith has worked with both NORTEP and the Gabriel Dumont Institute.

Mr. Goulet is currently a Member of the Legislative Assembly for Cumberland Constituency.


