

Cox House

Cox House (7348 Henderson Highway North, RM of St. Clements)

This area in the RM of St. Clements was used between 1840 and 1862 as a wood lot by retired HBC boatman and labourer John Cox (Scot) and his wife Nancy (Métis). In 1862, Cox gave his newly married son Robert Cox (Métis) the land here for a house and the Red River frame building that resulted was occupied by members of the Cox family until the mid-1970s. The building, a provincially designated historic site as of 1994, is undergoing renovations by its present owners.
