

Awards—Olive Dickason

Emerita Olive Dickason has once again been the recipient of an honorable award. On February 7, 1997 she received the National Aboriginal Lifetime Achievement Award from the Canadian Native Arts Foundation. Her achievements have brought a truer historical perspective to the history of Canada and Aboriginal people and inspired a whole generation of students to further probe what she started.

Past awards include: the Macdonald Prize - a most prestigious award in Canadian historiography, the Order of Canada, an Honorary Doctorate from the University of Alberta, the Dr. Joe Snowshoe Award from the First Nations Student Association at the University of Calgary, a Doctor of letters from the University of New Brunswick, and a Fellowship from Toronto's Ryerson Polytechnic University.
