Nault, Derrick M. (PhD.)

Dr. Derrick M. Nault is a citizen of the Red River Métis Nation and Assistant Professor of Indigenous Studies at the University of Winnipeg. He holds a Ph.D. in History from Queen's University, as well as an M.A. and B.A. in History from the University of Manitoba. His current research examines Métis history, focusing on kinship networks, allyship with Indigenous peoples, and collective memory.

Nault is a great-great-grandson of André Nault, Louis Riel's cousin and captain during the Red River Resistance, and a descendant of two councilors in Riel's 1885 Provisional Government, Jean-Baptiste Parenteau and Damase Carrière. He is also directly descended from Marie Pélagie (Dumont) Parenteau, a sister of Métis leader Gabriel Dumont.

He has held academic appointments at numerous institutions including the University of Tokyo, Algoma University, and the University of Calgary. While at the University of Tokyo, he was awarded a multi-year JSPS Grant-in-Aid (Category 'C'), the Japanese equivalent of Canada's SSHRC.

In addition to his academic work, Nault is actively involved in public history initiatives. He has contributed to the Michif Koonteur podcast and a documentary in progress titled *We and Us*, which explores the lives of descendants of the Red River Resistance. He has also shared his expertise on Métis history with the Manitoba Historical Society, St. Vital Historical Society, *La Liberté*, and the *Winnipeg Free Press*. As part of his commitment to accessible historical scholarship, he serves as Associate Editor (Indigenous Initiatives – Manitoba) for *Prairie History*, a journal that bridges academic and public history.
