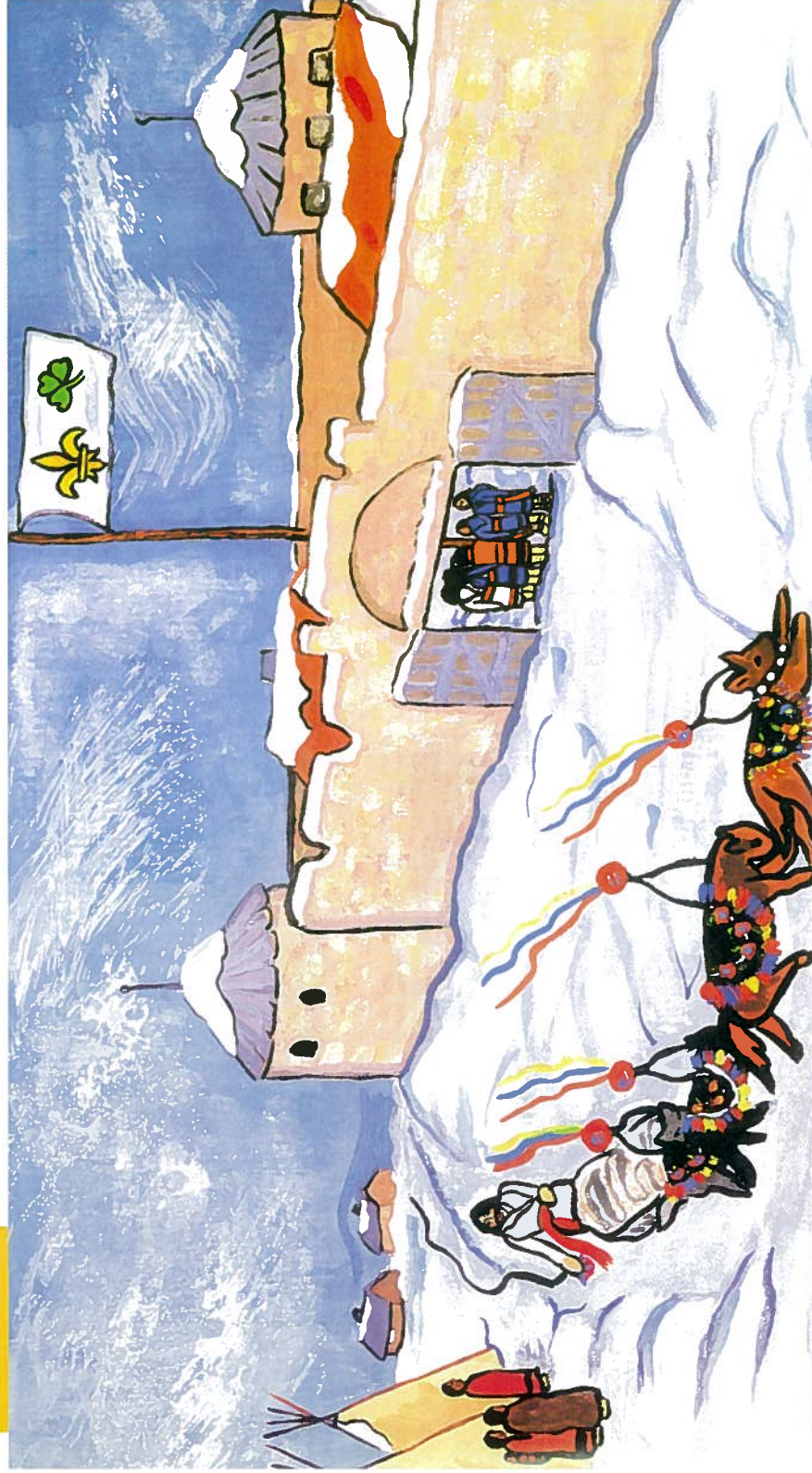

Who was Gabriel Dumont?

[1837-1906]

Gabriel Dumont is best remembered in Canadian history as Riel's general and commander of the forces in the North West Resistance of 1885. An overview of the life of Dumont shows that not only was he a natural choice for this role, he had also emerged as leader in his own right of the Métis people prior to the 1885 Resistance. He had an intimate knowledge of the people whom he led into battle and of the battlegrounds where he fought.

John is also an active promoter of fiddle music throughout Saskatchewan. He was an instructor at the Emma Lake Fiddlers' camp since its beginnings in 1988. John has been a guest artist and judge at fiddle contests for many years.
