



Who was Gabriel Dumont? [1837-1906]

Gabriel Dumont is best remembered in Canadian history as Riel's general and commander of the forces in the North West Resistance of 1885. An overview of the life of Dumont shows that not only was he a natural choice for this role, he had also emerged as leader in his own right of the Métis people prior to the 1885 Resistance. He had an intimate knowledge of the people whom he led into battle and of the battlegrounds where he fought.




Book 1: *Contrasting Worlds* is an overview of the Canadian West from the 1600s to the early 1870s, when many of the Métis moved from the Red River area to present-day Saskatchewan. (32 pages) ISBN 0-920915-09-4

Book 2: *Changing Times* is an examination of the governing bodies and the laws which were in effect in the Canadian West between 1821 and 1875. (24 pages) ISBN 00-9200915-10-8

Book 3: *Petitioning for Rights* is a study of the Métis attempts, from 1872-1883, to obtain title to their lands. (24 pages) ISBN 0-920915-11-6

Book 4: *Conflicting Plans* examines the conflict between the Métis and their attempt to gain legal ownership of their lands, and the federal government and its plans to implement the National Policy and to build a trans-continental railway. (24 pages) ISBN 0-920915-12-4





Métis Historical Booklet Series

Joanne Pelletier examines the history of the Métis from the early years of the fur trade through to the 1885 North-West Resistance. These booklets can be used by both high school students and adult learners who wish to further their understanding of Métis history. There are six books in the series: *The Buffalo Hunt*, *The Red River Insurgence 1869-70*, *The North-West Resistance of 1885*, *The Skirmish at Seven Oaks*, *Louis Riel* and *Gabriel Dumont*.

Gabriel Dumont is a biography of the famous Métis leader and buffalo hunter. It highlights his life, from his birth in the Red River settlement in 1837 to his death in 1906. (20 pages)

The Skirmish at Seven Oaks examines the underlying causes and events which led to the confrontation between the Selkirk settlers and the Métis in 1816. It emphasizes the fact that the conflict was not a racial conflict, but rather one which was instigated by the two rival fur companies for control of the fur trade. (19 pages)

The Red River Insurgence 1869-70 looks at the events leading up to the Red River Insurgence, the sequence of events during the turmoil, the end results, and its aftermath for the Métis people. (28 pages)

The North-West Resistance of 1885 outlines the reasons why the Métis were forced to take up arms to defend their rights in the Saskatchewan District. It also looks in some detail at the specific battles fought at Duck Lake, Fish Creek and Batoche.

Louis Riel is a biography of the famous Métis leader and politician. It does not contain detailed information of Riel's involvement in the events of 1869-70 or 1885. The subject matter of this booklet is of a more personal nature and is intended to develop an understanding of the forces which shaped Riel's life. (36 pages)

The Buffalo Hunt describes the activities of the large buffalo hunts which originated from the Red River Settlement during the nineteenth century. It outlines the activities of a typical hunt, and how the hunt provided the Metis with a means of income and furnished them with most of their essential needs. (24 pages)




Past Reflects the Present: The Métis Elders' Conference


ABOUT THE AUTHOR Fred Shore




Father Guy Lavallée

ABOUT THE MUSICIAN John Arcand

John Arcand was born in Big River, Saskatchewan in 1942, into a musical family. John started playing fiddle when he was six years old. He learned from his father, Victor. At the age of 12, John began to play for school dances, and for jig, square and round dancers. He is a composer and collector of fiddle tunes in the Métis tradition. John is also an active promoter of fiddle music throughout Saskatchewan. He was an instructor at the Emma Lake Fiddlers' camp since its beginnings in 1988. John has been a guest artist and judge at fiddle contests for many years.


