Long Lake (near Edmonton) Métis Scrip Applications

Long Lake now extinct was a long body of water located 10 km northwest of Edmonton.

Dylan Reade writes:

The community that arose at Long Lake (Kinokamau) in the mid-1860s, it is perhaps the most important of a number of pockets of pre-colonial settlement across Edmonton that I have been exploring in an effort to push past the city's conventional narrative and to establish biographies of its earliest -- pre-survey -- homesteaders. Long Lake's history and connection with Fort Edmonton extends back to the 1820s. By the 1850s it might be regarded as a primary satellite of the fort with year-round multi-purpose use and sixmonth long seasonal encampment over the winter. Although Long Lake survives now only as a stub of swamp at its former southern tip, I view it as the most historically consequential site in the city outside of its original forts. It was fundamentally a nucleus of community that grew to rival Fort Edmonton in size by the mid-1870s, anchored primarily around two inter-related Cree-French matriarchs. Its residents migrated *en masse* a decade later to fan out across both sides of the North Saskatchewan as founding families of Edmonton Settlement.¹
